An inspiration herself, Stefani Rose now lives for health, motivates others to take control over their lives, and uses the power of music and her own personal experience to reach out.

"*Reaching Out* is a song that's so universal. Every day, we use some variation of that phrase as we talk with people, do business, and communicate with family and friends; my goal is to follow through," said Stefani Rose. "While my cause is epilepsy awareness, I really want this song to challenge everyone to find a cause, find a group, find a person, and *reach out*."
